NOTICE TO APPLICANT FOR ADMISSION

An attorney who is qualified for admission must file an application with the Clerk of the United States Court of Appeals. Admission may be accomplished by mail. Applications and instructions are available at the Court's web site, www.ca1.uscourts.gov or by mail. The completed application and the admission fee should be mailed to the United States Court of Appeals, John Joseph Moakley United States Courthouse, 1 Courthouse Way, Suite 2500, Boston, MA 02210.

Admission may also be accomplished in person any morning that the Court is in session. The applicant must appear at the Clerk's Office by 8:30 a.m. on the day he or she plans to be admitted. Please verify that the Court will be sitting the day you wish to be admitted in person.

The fee for admission is fifty (\$50.00) dollars, payable in check or money order to Clerk, U.S. Court of Appeals. The Clerk's Office does not accept cash or credit card payments. The admission fee is waived if the attorney appears as (1) counsel for the United States or an officer or agency thereof, or (2) counsel appointed under the Criminal Justice Act in an appeal presently before the Court. However, if you are counsel for the U.S. or agency thereof, or are appointed under the Criminal Justice Act and would like a certificate of admission there is a two (\$2.00) dollar charge.

Once admitted, the attorney will be assigned a First Circuit Court of Appeals Bar Number which must be used on any pleading filed with the Court.
